📖 We learn this mitzvah from Parshas Tzav: (ויקרא ה:ח)

וְכֹל חֲטָאת אֲשֶׁר יֹבֵא  
מִדְּמָה אֶל אֵהָל מוֹעֵד  
לְכַפֵּר בַּקֹּדֶשׁ לֹא תֹאכַל  
בְּאֵשׁ תִּשְׂרֹף


A *Kohen* is usually able to eat from a *Korban Chatas*. But a *kohen* can NOT eat from any *Korban Chatas* that has its blood sprinkled inside of the *Kodesh* or the *Kodesh Hakodoshim* (on the *Mizbeich Haketores*, the *Paroches*, or the *Aron*).

📖 We learn this mitzvah from Parshas Vayikra: (ויקרא ז:א)

וּמֶלֶק אֶת רֵאשׁוֹ מִמוּל  
עֵרְפוֹ וְלֹא יִבְדִּיל

A bird that is brought for a *Korban* doesn't get *shechted* with a knife, it gets *shechted* with a very sharp fingernail! This is called *Melikah*. It is a *mitzvah* for the *Kohen* to make sure not to cut off the whole head when he is *shechting* it.

 The details of this mitzvah are explained in Mishnayos & Gemara: *Mesechta Zevachim perek Vov*

## Rambam: Hilchos Maaseh HaKorbanos

### PEREK DALED

We learn about WHEN *Korbanos* are allowed to be brought (during the day) and also what we need to think about when we bring the *Korban* — *Kavana*!

### PEREK HEY

This *perek* teaches us WHERE we bring *Korbanos*, and how we give the different parts of the *Korban* to Hashem.

### PEREK VOV

We learn EXACTLY how to bring a *Korban Olah*!
