 This mitzvah includes all of the details of the Yom Kippur Avodah as written in Parshas Acharei.

Today we learn the same *mitzvah* as yesterday again. This is a *mitzvah* with a lot of details — we need to do the **WHOLE Avodah** of Yom Kippur, exactly like it says in the Torah!

 We learn this mitzvah from Parshas Vayikra: (ויקרא ה:טז)

וְאֵת אֲשֶׁר חָטָא מִן הַקֹּדֶשׁ  
יִשְׁלֵם וְאֵת חֲמִישְׁתּוֹ  
יוֹסֵף עָלָיו

If someone ate from a *korban* or *Terumah*, he needs to return the amount that he ate, plus an extra fifth.

## Rambam: Hilchos Avodas Yom HaKipurim, Hilchos Me'ilah

### PEREK DALED

Now the Rambam tells us the *seder* of the day of Yom Kippur.

### PEREK HEY

We learn what happens if the *Avodah* was done in the wrong order, or if something wasn't done exactly like it says in the Torah.

### PEREK ALEF

*Me'ilah* is using something that was set aside for Hashem, which is *asur*. One of the things we learn about is using the wool of an animal that is *hekdesh*, and when this is considered *Me'ilah*.
