 We learn this mitzvah from Parshas Chukas: (במדבר י"ט:ט)
וְהִיתָה לְעֵדוּת בְּנֵי יִשְׂרָאֵל
לְמִשְׁמֶרֶת

Today's *mitzvah* is the same as yesterday's: It is a *mitzvah* to prepare the *Parah Adumah* so its ashes can be used to make *Yidden Tahor* from *Tumas Meis*.
