Today we learn the same *mitzvah* as yesterday — that a man who gets a certain kind of *tumah* is called a “Zav” and can make other things *tomei* too, even just by leaning on them!

⚠ This mitzvah includes all of the halachos of Tumas Neveilah, and does not have a specific posuk we learn it from.

We also learn a new *mitzvah* — about the kind of *tumah* that comes from the body of a *neveila* — a dead animal.

PEREK YUD-GIMMEL

There are some people that are careful about the *halachos* of *tumah* and *tahara*. Such a person is called a *Chaver*. Other people are called *Amei Ha'aretz*. If your workers are *Amei Ha'aretz*, you need to watch them carefully to make sure your products stay *tahor*. If a *chaver* wasn't paying attention to his possessions, they may become *tamei*.

PEREK ALEF

The first *perek* of *Hilchos Shaar Avos HaTumah* teaches us that a dead body of an animal, or part of one, makes other things *Tomei*. If a kosher animal was *shechted*, it does not make other things *tomei*.

PEREK BEIS

Now we learn what happens when a (non-kosher) animal is *shechted* — it does not make other things *tomei* until it has stopped moving.
