 We learn this mitzvah from Parshas Mishpatim: (שמות כ"ה)

כִּי תֵצֵא אִשׁ וּמִצָּאָה קִצִּים

Today's *mitzvah* is that if someone sets a fire, he is responsible to pay for anything the fire burns.

 The details of this mitzvah are explained in Mishnayos & Gemara: Mesechta Bava Kama perek Beis and Perek Vov

Rambam: Hilchos Nizkei Mamon

PEREK TES

This *perek* explains how much the owner needs to pay when his animal hurt an animal that was pregnant, two separate animals, or an animal that belongs to two people!

PEREK YUD

The Rambam teaches us that an animal who kills a person needs to be killed. If the animal was *mu'ad* (we could expect that it would do it) then the owner also needs to pay a fine.

PEREK YUD-ALEF

This *perek* explains how we figure out how much the fine should be. We also learn the *halachos* about what happens if the animal that was supposed to get killed gets mixed up with other animals, or if it is pregnant.
