 We learn this mitzvah from Parshas Behar: (ויקרא כה:יד)

וְכִי תִמְכְּרוּ מִמְכָּר לְעַמִּיתְךָ

Today's *mitzvah* is the same one again — that buying and selling the way the Torah teaches is a *mitzvah*!

 The details of this mitzvah are explained in Mishnayos & Gemara: Mesechta Kiddushin perek Alef, Mesechta Bava Metziah perakim Daled and Ches, and Mesechta Bava Basra perakim Gimmel, Daled, Hey, Vov and Zayin

Rambam: Hilchos Zechiya U'Matana

PEREK DALED

In this *perek*, the Rambam teaches us that usually you have to agree to take a present, or else it's not yours. But sometimes another person can agree FOR you.

PEREK HEY

The Rambam teaches us about what happens if two people argue over a field: One says that it was sold to him, and the other one says he got it as a present. This could happen if the person gave a present secretly. That's one of the reasons why a person shouldn't give presents secretly, so there won't be arguments who it belongs to!

PEREK VOV

This *perek* has *halachos* about presents to a person in the family. Some of them are *halachos* about the presents a *Chosson* sends to his *Kallah*!
