## וְכִי תִמְכְּרוּ מִמְכָּר לְעַמִּיתְךָ

Today's *mitzvah* is the same *mitzvah* AGAIN! (When we are learning many *halachos* connected with the same *mitzvah* in Rambam, we just keep reviewing it in *Sefer Hamitzvos*!) When we do business, buying or selling things, we need to do it the way the Torah teaches us.

 The details of this mitzvah are explained in Mishnayos & Gemara: Mesechta Kiddushin perek Alef, Mesechta Bava Metziah perakim Daled and Ches, and Mesechta Bava Basra perakim Gimmel, Daled, Hey, Vov and Zayin

## Rambam: Hilchos Zechiya U'Matana

### PEREK YUD

In today's Rambam, we learn more about a present from a person who is very sick (a "*Shechiv MeRa*").

This *perek* explains what we do when the *Shechiv Mera* says that money belongs to another person, or if another person says that the *Shechiv Mera* owed him money.

### PEREK YUD-ALEF

The Rambam tells us what to do when the words of the *Shechiv Mera* aren't so clear. Like if he says, "give this money to Tuvia," what do we do if two people called Tuvia come and ask for the money? (If one of them is a *Talmid Chochom*, we say that probably the *Shechiv Mera* meant him, or if one of them is his friend we say it is probably him.)

### PEREK YUD-BEIS

In this *perek* we learn about how carefully we listen to the words of a sick person and do exactly what he asked.
