 We learn this mitzvah from Parshas Behar: (ויקרא כה:יד)

וְכִי תִמְכְּרוּ מִמְכָּר לְעַמִּיתְךָ

Today's *mitzvah* is — you guessed it, the very same *mitzvah* again! When we buy things and sell things (or even give presents), there are rules in Torah about how to do it, and who the things belong to when.

 The details of this mitzvah are explained in Mishnayos & Gemara: Mesechta Kiddushin perek Alef, Mesechta Bava Metziah perakim Daled and Ches, and Mesechta Bava Basra perakim Gimmel, Daled, Hey, Vov and Zayin

PEREK HEY

In today's Rambam, we learn more about partners:

In this *perek* we learn about what happens when one of the partners doesn't do what they agreed. If he sold the potatoes for too cheap, he needs to pay his partner back for the money that was lost. But if he sold them for a lot of money, they need to split the money!

PEREK VOV

This *perek* teaches us about a kind of partnership where one person just gives the money, and the other person does all the work.

PEREK ZAYIN

This *perek* tells us what happens when the person doing all the work doesn't do it right.
