 We learn this mitzvah from Parshas Beshalach: (שמות טז:כט)

אַל יֵצֵא אִישׁ מִמֶּקְמוֹ בַּיּוֹם הַשְּׁבִיעִי

Today's *mitzvah* is the same as yesterday's — not to go out of the *Techum Shabbos*. The *Techum Shabbos* is an area of 2,000 *amos* (about 1 kilometer, or over a half mile) surrounding the city. We aren't allowed to travel past that point on Shabbos.

We learn this from the *posuk* “No person should leave his place on the seventh day.” The *Gemara* says that this means not to go more than 2,000 *amos* outside of the city.

If someone does go outside of the *Techum Shabbos*, they get *Malkos*.

Rambam: Hilchos Shabbos

PERAKIM CHOF-ALEF, CHOF-BEIS, AND CHOF-GIMMEL

In today's Rambam, we learn about not doing a *sh'vus*. A *sh'vus* is something which the *Chachomim* said is *asur* either because it is LIKE the way we do a *melacha*, or because it is something that might make someone forget and actually DO the *melacha*. Many of the

things we don't do on Shabbos are because of *sh'vus*.

All three *perakim* today teach us about different kinds of *sh'vus*. The Rambam organizes them according to which *melacha* they are based on.
