Ⓢ This mitzvah is not said clearly in the Torah. We learn this mitzvah as a Gezeira Shava — since the Torah teaches that it is asur to marry a grandchild, OF COURSE it must be asur to marry a daughter!

Ⓢ We learn this mitzvah from Parshas Acharei: (ויקרא יח:ז)

תִגְלֶה עָרוֹתָן כִּי עָרוֹתְךָ הֵנָּה

A man can't marry his daughter's daughter (his granddaughter).

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Ⓢ We learn this mitzvah from Parshas Acharei: (ויקרא יח:ז)

לֹא תִגְלֶה

A man can't marry a woman and her daughter — for example, marrying his mother-in-law or his wife's daughter.
